


The Mentor: Leadership Trumps Bullying

Many explanations of bullying focus on issues related to self-esteem and the drive to exert power over others through means of physical, emotional, cyber, verbal, sexual and other repeated aggressive behaviors.

Effective mentoring programs are major contributing factors to reducing bullying. By establishing an effective mentoring process we actively engage the students to become part of the solution. *The Mentor: Leadership Trumps Bullying* is designed as a pro-active strategy to reduce or minimize bullying. The process focuses on creating a peer mentoring process to strengthen relationships and leadership skills to build a school culture of empathy, as well as the various challenges and issues surrounding bullying.

Bullying statistic: 71% of students report incidents of bullying as a problem at school

Bullying statistic: 30% of students are involved in bullying on a regular basis either as a victim, bully or both

Bullying statistic: 15% of all school absenteeism is directly related to fears of being bullied at school

Bullying statistic: 43% of kids have been bullied while online. 1 in 4 have had it happen more than once

Bullying statistic: As many as 160,000 students stay home on any given day because they're afraid of being bullied

During the Day One school team training, participants will:

- Clarify bullying and conflict in schools today
- Complete readiness assessments and targeted bully-victim-witness assessments
- Learn the three steps of mentoring in student friendly language
- Practice the strategies of mentoring through simulations of common bullying situations

During Day Two student team training, students will:

- Clarify bullying and conflict situations
- Explore Bully-Victim-Bystander interpersonal behaviors
- Engage students in conversations focused on building school relationships where everyone is a mentor
- Be empowered to model positive behaviors and of empathy

Ultimately, teams will be able to transfer the critical elements of the pro-active process to decrease bullying and increase student leadership therefore improving overall school culture.
