• WHAT MINIMUM COMPETENCY DOES A STUDENT NEED TO SHOW TO EARN A CARNEGIE UNIT?

- **A: 704 KAR 3:305 – MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION**
- REQUIRED COMPETENCIES INCLUDE SOME FROM KY CORE ACADEMIC STANDARDS AND SOME SET BY KY COUNCIL ON POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION. MUST MEET CPE STANDARDS OR TAKE A TRANSITIONAL COURSE OR INTERVENTION WHICH IS MONITORED PRIOR TO EXITING HIGH SCHOOL. IN 13 KAR 2:020
- PASS A CARNEGIE UNIT COURSE – IN THIS REG. IS 120 HOURS OF INSTRUCTIONAL TIME, OR
- CAN REQUIRE STANDARDS – BASED-PERFORMANCE BASED CREDIT – LOCAL BOARD MUST HAVE A POLICY
 - INTERNSHIPS; TECHNICAL CLASSES DEMONSTRATING COMPETENCY

• WHAT IS THE LINE BETWEEN ACCOMMODATIONS AND MODIFICATIONS IN THE CLASSROOM?

- **A: CANNOT MODIFY THE CONTENT – APPLY KY ACADEMIC STANDARDS DOCUMENT INCORPORATED INTO 704 KAR 3:303**
- WHAT STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO BE ABLE TO DEMONSTRATE THEY CAN DO
- **LEVELS K-5 AND 6-12 AND SOME GRADE TO GRADE**
 - A PRIMARY SCHOOL SCIENCE ONE IS "PLAN AND CONDUCT INVESTIGATION ABOUT EFFECTS OF DIFFERENT STRENGTHS ON THE MOTION OF AN OBJECT LIKE STOPPING A BALL FROM ROLLING OR TWO PERSONS COLLIDING".
 - LANGUAGE ARTS ONE IS "RECOGNIZING AND CORRECTING INAPPROPRIATE SHIFTS IN PRONOUN NUMBER AND PERSON".

• ACCOMMODATIONS ARE CHANGES IN:

- THE WAY INSTRUCTION AND MATERIALS ARE PRESENTED;
- THE WAY A STUDENT MAY COMPLETE AN ASSIGNMENT OR TEST;
- THE WAY A CLASSROOM OR OTHER LEARNING ENVIRONMENT IS ARRANGED OR EQUIPPED;
AND
- THE AMOUNT OF TIME A STUDENT HAS TO COMPLETE WORK AND TESTS.
- ACCOMMODATIONS REDUCE OR ELIMINATE THE EFFECTS OF A STUDENT'S DISABILITY ON HIS ABILITY TO PERFORM A TASK.
- ACCOMMODATIONS ARE NOT INTENDED TO CHANGE THE CONTENT OF A COURSE OR REDUCE THE STANDARDS OF A PROGRAM.

• EXAMPLES OF ACCOMMODATIONS

- PRESENTING INFORMATION IN DIFFERENT FORMATS LIKE TEXT READERS, GRAPHIC ORGANIZERS, AND PARAPHRASING
- ALLOWING STUDENTS TO COMPLETE ASSIGNMENTS AND TESTS IN DIFFERENT WAYS LIKE ORAL RATHER THAN WRITTEN
- CHANGING THE STUDENT'S PHYSICAL WORK SPACE LIKE ALLOWING A STUDENT WITH HYPERACTIVITY TO SIT ON AN EXERCISE BALL WHILE WRITING
- INCREASING THE AMOUNT OF TIME A STUDENT HAS TO COMPLETE AN ASSIGNMENT OR SCHEDULING INCREASED BREAK TIME DURING THE ASSIGNMENT
- LETTING A STUDENT TAPE A CLASS RATHER THAN TAKING WRITTEN NOTES
- LESSENING THE AMOUNT OF HOMEWORK DUE TO STUDENT'S INABILITY TO FOCUS FOR LONG PERIODS OR PHYSICAL STAMINA PROBLEMS CAUSED BY DISABILITY
